 - Anchorage



- 1. Reduce average residential water/sewer rates by two-thirds
- 2. Reduce the cost and number of emergencies through proper Preventative Maintenance performed by operators
- 3. Provide regional training and support for operators and administrators

4. Increase Construction grant possibilities for communities through increasing Best Practice scores











CUAP Results

- Preventative Maintenance Plans from 27% to 80%
- Revenue collections up from 88% to 102%
- Best Practice scores up from 74 to 83 (highest in the state)
- Rural operator certification pass rate up from 7-8% to ~35%
